During the 2006/07contract year we have run 15 courses, 3 cancelled due to low registrations, and 1 cancelled at the Course Director's request.

It was with regret that we farewelled Colleen McClymont, and wished her well as she ventured overseas. Thank you to those of you who took the time to come and say farewell.

A new appointment was made, and Laura Collins joined the permanent team of two. An enormous vote of thanks needs to go to Chris Mitchell in agreeing to the development of changes to her job description allowing TRCC to utilise the skills and expertise within the office. I would like to acknowledge the fabulous job that Laura and Chris do in making everyone's job so much easier, and it's a pleasure to work alongside them both.

This has been a year of change and transformation within the office with the installation of the new carpet, computer upgrades are in the pipeline to cope with the increasing need for faster and more efficient systems, and we are looking into updating our website.

Our professional development this year was provided by Martin Henry, our liaison person from the Ministry of Education, and looked at (BES) Best Evidence Synthesis. Thank you to the Committee for the enormous amount of work you do not only in attending fortnightly meetings, but also in providing the support and expertise as liaison people at the courses you support throughout the year. The 2008/ 09 contract year promises to be an exciting one, with a good range of courses covering all sectors. It is also pleasing to have the Pasifika strand alive and well, and we look forward to working more with this lively and enthusiastic group of teachers.
